TROUT FISHING DAY PERMIT

£30

This permit covers Queens Valley Reservoirs and Val De La Mare

It is a condition of the permit that the rules below are followed.

Any day Key provided carries a £5 deposit and is to be returned to the tackle shop where obtained for a refund

The two fish limit applies from 1st April to 31st October, from 1st November to 31st March its catch and release only.

RELEVANT EXTRACTS FROM THE TROUT ANGLING RULES

Until further notice all Brown trout must be returned unless deep hooked/bleeding. No fish are to be retained in keep-nets or carp sacks on the recognised trout fishing waters, unless otherwise directed by Committee.

If arriving at a reservoir by vehicle all anglers will park in the car parks provided for the general public. Do not park on the slip road at Queens Valley as this is used as emergency access and by Jersey Water employees only.

The catch and release rules are:-

- a) barbless or crushed barbs only
- b) if you decide to keep your limit of two fish you must stop fishing
- c) deep hooked or bleeding fish must be taken as part of the two fish limit
- d) net all fish carefully, minimise handling and return as quickly as possible
- e) use of de-hookers are recommended

Fishing is permitted between one hour before sunrise and one hour after sunset throughout the season.

Fishing is by artificial fly only using either barbed or barbless or crushed barbs, cast in the conventional style.

It is strictly not permitted to:-

- (i) Use artificial aids to casting.
- (ii) Troll in any form from the boats.
- (iii) Loose feed from either the boats or the banks.

Fishing from the dams or any structure is forbidden with the exception of the pontoon at Queens Valley.

The permit will be withdrawn if any of the above conditions are contravened.

Fishing is not permitted in any of the Silt Ponds.

Holder should carry their permit/card whenever on Jersey Water property with the intention of fishing.

All gates used by members of the Association are to be kept locked at all times.

As larger fish now being stocked and in order to avoid leaving flies in fish, it is recommended that monofilament line finer than 5lb breaking strain should not be used.

Life jackets to be worn before moving onto pontoons and Day Tickets do not confer use of the boats unless specifically approved by a Committee member.

Rule 87. Queens Valley Upper-Fly Fishing Pilot-May to September

The Committee for 2015 is undertaking a pilot scheme to provide enhanced fly only sport during the warmer/hotter months on this fly only reservoir given its head of carp by allowing the use of **floating feed** (maximum of 1 Kilo per day-dog/cat biscuits or 1 Loaf-under no circumstances are floating trout pellets to be used) to induce surface feeding. Flies can take the form of tied/sourced imitations and a minimum of 8lb leader must be used. All coarse fish to be returned to the water

AWARENESS & SAFETY

It is a condition of membership that before fishing you have read and adhere to the membership and rules booklet, if unsure on any aspect please contact a member of the Committee who will answer or arrange to have any queries answered.

All members should take appropriate measures to ensure their safety and the safety of others.

These include:-

- 1 Care when back casting to avoid injury to yourself and others, for fly fisherman caps and glasses are recommended
- 2 For the trout waters life jackets must be worn on both boats and prior to accessing the pontoons.
- 3 Any Member or Association Official authorised to use a boat, or working in or over water must wear a suitable floatation device.
- 4 When fishing alone ensure others are aware of where you are and your likely return time
- 5 Access and use staging with care and whilst they will be checked regularly they can be slippery and changing conditions and water levels **can make them hazardous with significant risk**
6. Anglers are recommended to consider the use of lifejackets/buoyancy aids when bank fishing having regard to your circumstances and deep water
